# NEWS OWORO BACK-TO-SCHOOL PROJECT





The State Universal Basic Education Board released its schools' admissions lists in January, and CLL was able to ensure 37 out-of-school children were placed in local schools. The children were provided with uniforms, school bags and materials. CLL is monitoring the progress of these children in their schools, liaising regularly with their teachers (we are working to place an additional 3 children in school to reach our minimum target of 40 back in school this academic year).

Supplemental remedial classes in basic literacy and numeracy are continuing, even now that school has started, to provide learning support. Once a week, fun extracurricular activities are organised. These classes are open to all, not just the children selected as beneficiaries of this project.

#### STAKEHOLDERS / PARENTS FORUM

#### **PARENTING CLASSES**

Staff conducted workshops for parents to talk about good parenting skills, child rights and child abuse. The importance of education, good hygiene and nutrition were also included in topics discussed.

#### **SKILLS ACQUISITION CLASSES**

CLL organized classes in cookery and how to make snacks for parents/care-givers of project beneficiaries. Classes planned include gele-tying and make up as commercial activities. Already, one participant has started a small-scale business frying and selling puff-puff, and is making income from it.
