NEW CENTER AND IMPROVED SERVICE

Staff resumed work after the New Year in CLL's newly acquired office and reception centre at 3, Karimu Street, not far from the location of the old one, in Gbagada. The reception center which had been closed due to Covid19 has re-opened. This quarter, 3 children were taken off the street and placed at CLL's Ibeshe home for care and protection.



ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Taofik Olaniyan was reunited with his parents three years ago after spending six years at CLL's Ibeshe home. With continued support from CLL for his education, he sat for the Senior Secondary **Certificate Examination** (SSCE), achieving good grades, and sat for the JAMB exams. On the basis of his results, he applied to Grandplus College of Education, Ilorin, passing their entrance examinations and being awarded a tuition-free scholarship to study Political Science/Social Studies Education.

GBAGADA DROP IN CENTER

Street children from Oshodi come to our reception centre daily. On arrival, they register at the gate. They wash their clothes, bathe, and change into CLL-provided clothing for the day. They are given breakfast and a cooked lunch; they attend basic numeracy and literacy classes and engage in other extracurricular activities. CLL provides a safe space off the streets and a place to get adult help.



HOME TRACING

Q left home because he was unable to continue his education. He came to CLL's reception centre where we counselled him and traced his family in Ibadan. His mother was so happy to hear that her son was alive and well. With his family's support, Q was referred to the CLL home for rehabilitation and placement back in school.

DIGITALLY CONNECTING STREET CHILDREN'S WORKSHOP

A workshop on Digitally Connecting Street Children was organized in January and facilitated by the Housemaster. The Consortium for Street Children pioneered the program by hosting an online platform where street children in member countries are connected digitally, in a safe online space. The boys at CLL residential home, Ibeshe had a good time participating in all the online activities which included expressing their views on children's rights, viewing video content made by other children and commenting on them, posting about their own experiences on the street, and taking part in a quiz and polling to give feedback on the platform.
