TWENTY-TWO CHILDREN RESCUED FROM THE STREET

Eighty children benefited from our Drop-in-Center services in the second quarter; twenty-two children were rescued from the street and placed in shelters run by CLL and two other NGOs within the Lagos State Child Protection Network (CPN) for care and protection.






Twelve children were reunited with their families; home is the best place for a child to grow.

INTERNATIONAL DAY FOR STREET CHILDREN was celebrated on 12th of April; this year's theme was 'Recognizing Frontline Workers'. CLL spent the day visiting street children living under the Oshodi bridge in Lagos, talking to them about their hopes and educating them on their rights.

CLL also organized a child-friendly workshop at our Ibeshe Rehabilitation Home, facilitated by Mrs. Ronke Oyelakin, the State Coordinator of the Lagos State CPN, and another for children in Oworonshoki to sensitize them on their rights as children. They were given food items donated by the **Lagos Food Bank**.

CLL children and staff paid an advocacy visit to Kosofe Local Government offices. They were welcomed by the Chairman, Hon. Moyo Ogunlewe and the Secretary, Lagos State CPN, Alhaji Awofeso. The Chairman promised to help all children to get birth certificates.
