The team, led by the Program Manager, reviewed the development plans for each individual child at the residential home. The rehabilitation progress and development of each resident child is monitored through their personal Child Development Plan (CDP).

The team assessed the development needs, opportunities and challenges of each child, as well as progress made against a previous plan, and adjusted its CDP as required. These are reviewed every 6 months.

## BACK-TO-SCHOOL PROJECT OWORONSHOKI



40 children have been selected for CLL's Back-to-School project in Oworonshoki, sponsored by the Consortium for Street children (CSC)/Red Nose Day U.S.A. 22 of them have never been to school; 18 had been registered in schools but dropped out due to poverty.

CLL has applied for school placements for all the children and for birth certificates for those who do not have them. We appreciate the cooperation received from the State Ministry of Youth & Social Development, the State Universal Basic Education Board, the Kosofe Local Government and the National Population Commission in enabling this.

### REMEDIAL CLASSES

Several children are illiterate, so CLL organized remedial classes on weekdays, pending their admission to schools and re-opening of the schools, to help them achieve basic competencies in literacy and numeracy. These classes will continue even after they start school, to help them cope. Other children in the community that are not official beneficiaries of the project have joined the classes.

Thank you, Dr. Kaine Dosekun (*CLL Executive*), for coming to teach in one of the classes. The children had so much fun learning. We truly appreciate the time and support.

### PARENTAL TRAINING
